



# Champion of Champions

Conditions of Play



To be read in conjunction with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Third Edition) and Bowls Domestic Regulations and the Centres General Conditions of Play. The Tournament Manager reserves the right to amend conditions of play due to light, inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Please note: A Club member who has dual membership may only play in **one** club's championship discipline during a season, including but not limited to regular, substitute or acquired players. If a Club member is found to have ignored this condition, then that player (and team) will be disqualified from the Bowls Wellington Champion of Champions event as no replacement player will be permitted.

The winner of each Club competition must have completed a minimum of three matches. If only two entries are received a minimum of two matches must have been completed.

## 1. Eligibility

Club Champions must be found by competition with open or drawn entries being called for and all team members must be of the same gender.

Where a club has only one entry, dispensation may be granted by Bowls Wellington for that entrant to be eligible to enter the Champion of Champion event. Please contact Bowls Wellington for approval.

The team members of the team that wins a Club Championship are the players who shall be nominated by the club for entry to the Champion of Champions event. Any change in personnel shall be subject to the prior approval of Bowls Wellington and shall be limited to one Substitute and/or one Replacement player (Bowls New Zealand Domestic Regulation 7.5).

## 2. Entries

Each club championship winner (Junior Singles, Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours) is eligible to enter the Wellington Champion of Champion series. These knockout tournaments are played over 5 rounds with 3 games on Day 1 and the Semifinals and Finals being played on the Ryman Healthcare Champion of Champion Finals Weekend scheduled for 2 & 3 April 2022. Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours are all Centre Title and Gold Star events.

Clubs are responsible for entering their teams on the official entry forms as provided by Bowls Wellington with the full names of all players and, if appropriate, a request for a Substitute or Replacement player and the reason.

### 3. **Change to playing personnel**

Any change in playing personnel shall be subject to the prior approval of the Centre Controlling Body and shall be limited as per Regulation 7 of the Laws of the Sport (Crystal Mark Third Edition). As per Regulation 7, **any changes to personnel must be considered as equal or lesser ability in the eyes of the Tournament Manager and wherever possible must not have played in the competition including the Club Championship qualifying stages.**

### 4. **Substitute/ Replacement**

These are defined in Bowls NZ Domestic Regulation 7 and summarised as:

A substitute is a player who is temporarily filling in for a player who is expected to return to the team prior to the event finishing. They may not play as skip. A replacement player is one who is 'replacing' an original team member for the duration of the event as they will not be returning, and can play as skip (7.4 domestic regs). A singles player cannot have a Substitute or Replacement.

**Players who choose to play in another Tournament (Unless a Bowls NZ National Tournament) will not be permitted to have a Substitute or Replacement Team Member.**

### 5. **1-5 Year Singles**

Players who have been active members of a Club for a period not exceeding five years, including the current season, are eligible to play in the 1-5 Singles. The five seasons do not have to be consecutive. An Active member is one who would be eligible to play in club events, whether they have chosen to or not.
